Bishop John: Pilgrim and Adventurer



+John Roundhill, our regional bishop, is off on another Holy Week Pilgrimage Walk from Brisbane to the Border.

Rev Andrew had the chance to catch up with Bishop John this week and learnt a bit more about what has become an Easter tradition in the diocese. It's a chance to connect with people of faith within and beyond our buildings. He walks with folk from local churches and is amazed at the profound conversations he has with other non church folk found along the way too.

+John starts on Saturday 12th at St John's Bulimba and walks for a week to arrive and celebrate Maundy Thursday with St James' church at Coomera Waters, Good Friday with Biggera Waters, Southport and Surfers Paradise churches then on to St John's Burleigh Heads for Easter Eve. Along the way he stops for prayer, fellowship and sustenance at a total of 16 churches and communities and walks about 140 kms over the 7 days.

Spider Woman walks among us!

No, not a suited Marvel Comic heroine, but a wonderful acknowledgement for our own Mel Lawrence who has the honour of having a Queensland spider named after her!




Mel shared the following amazing news: "And it's official, wishbone spider "Aname lawrenceae" is now officially a named species. I work with amazing scientists, researchers and individuals.

Congratulations to Dr Jeremy Wilson for mammoth 300pg work, revising 68 species, including 55 new species. Wilson JD, Harvey MS, Simmons LW & Rix MG. (2025). An integrative systematic revision of the wishbone spiders (Araneae: Anamidae: Aname L. Koch, 1873) of subtropical and tropical eastern Australia, with the description of 55 new species. European Journal of Taxonomy 985: 1–298.

DOI: <u>https://doi.org/10.5852/ejt.2025.985.2845</u> "The specific epithet 'lawrenceae' honours Melinda Lawrence, for the friendship and support she provided to the

authors in her role as Project Manager, Project DIG. Project DIG, a collaboration between the QMN and BHP, provided funding that allowed the authors to conduct fieldwork throughout Queensland, which led to the collection of many new specimens and a wealth of natural history information on eastern Aname."

This species is found in the Queensland central highlands near Carnarvon Gorge, at Huttons Creek and Carnarvon Station. That general area is a hotspot of localised Aname diversity, and both of the known specimens were collected by the late Geoff Monteith in 2002 and 2013. We don't currently have a live image of this species, but this may be rectified in due course. An interesting species from a fascinating and diverse area."

David says "This was never intended to be a business. When we started the shed the whole idea was for supporting men in all ways. Men's health was the most important thing. We

started with 6 men and we now have over 210 members. This number was never in our dreams. My goal is to have a

shed where we all could come and enjoy ourselves. We have a great reputation for helping the community, and all groups. Also we have 3 charities that we support - the Mater Little Miracles, Black Dog Institute and Catherine's House at the Mater, plus all the local people and charities around Wynnum area. Now we have 3 great sheds, I never ever thought that we would be down on the esplanade with these 3 sheds, but we now need at least another"

The pics tell part of the story. Member Peter is shown with the special cup stand holders he is making for local older folk. The turned bowls at the top have a slot for the cup handle to sit safely. Peter reckons the wood for the spindles came from a local church... maybe our own St Paul's! Perhaps an eagle

eyed parishioner can confirm that!.

Other projects include small holding crosses for a local church... we have ordered some very cost effective ones for ourselves that will be made out of some of the pew wood they hold from St Paul's... these will add to the beautiful ones made by Col last year to give away. Keep an eye out over Holy Week for other work of their hands.

The Vicar's Voice: Holy Week? Why bother? Holy Week begins this Sunday with the loud Hosanna-ing of palms and branches and the congregation flinging their garments on the ground. And then Easter Sunday will have the C and Es among us and the promise of an Easter egg. So, why should we bother with the bits in between? Surely three or so other services is a bit of an overkill and really only for the holiest of the redeemed and sanctified among us? Maundy Thursday is a bit icky with threats of having to expose smelly feet and of course Good Friday is just too sad and upsets me. And a 5.30am start on Easter Sunday! Tell 'em they're joking!

Well, I love it. Not because I get to prance around and put on a show or two (although I have done that sometimes). It's not 'cause I'm paid and have to and get time in lieu. It's because it's the most spiritually nourishing, heart warming and challenging time of the year. For Christians it's the Grand Final of the liturgical year... More important even than Christmas... and that's pretty important.

I love the unfolding of the story over Holy Week. It's one great liturgy that starts on Palm Sunday and goes right through to the joy of Easter morning. It calls us deeply into the story in physical, earthy, confronting and challenging ways. It allows us to travel in real time the events of those momentous three days so long ago. It touches and breaks my heart and then lifts up me up again in hope and promise.

An added bonus is that I don't tend to preach much... and you all know I love a captive audience and the chance to have an opinion. The liturgies are such rich story telling, the imagery so profound and the scripture and prayers so finely crafted that I just don't think I could do a better job. So I tend to shut up for once.

I'd love you to share the journey with me... or find a space to do so if you are away. 9.30 am on Maundy Thursday and 9.30 am on Good Friday can be watched on Zoom using the usual Sunday Morning Links. We can organise lifts if you need. Just come.
