Let the love flow as we celebrate our shared patronal day with our friends at St Peter's Wynnum this weekend.

Legend has it that our patron saints were executed on the same day under the command of Emperor Nero and buried in Rome. (Although historical accounts cite Peter being martyred in 64 AD and Paul in 67 AD.)

Because of his Roman citizenship, Saint Paul was beheaded. St. Peter was reportedly crucified upside down because he said he was not worthy to be sacrificed in the same manner as Christ. There's evidence to suggest their martyrdom was remembered on the same day from as early as 258 CE.

On Sunday 8 June, Amanda Moran, along with hubby Peter, Sydney based daughter, Tara plus two wonderful girlfriends braved a chilly early start to walk two kilometres as part of Dementia Australia's Memory Walk & Jog.

Amanda writes: Walking in honour of Dave Stannard (Dad or Pop and late husband of our mum Ann) who we sadly lost to dementia in August 2023 and for the 421,000 Australians currently living with dementia, the team – Pop's Crew – donned white cowboy hats with Pop's photo on them to display their support.







Not many people know, but dementia is Australia's second-leading cause of death, and the number of people impacted is only going up. By 2054 it's expected that more than 800,000 Australians will have dementia.

All money raised will support the work of Dementia Australia and help provide vital support services like counselling, support groups, education, and research to help find a cure. A guest speaker at the August Mother's Union meeting will be hearing more about dementia and the work of De-

mentia Australia.

The 1,361 Memory Walk & Jog participants on Sunday 8 June raised over \$182,000!

Pop's Crew even caught up with the King, Wally Lewis after the walk, who attended to show his support to the cause.

"Marj never wanted to be ordinary. She was a creative soul and she wanted to be an artist, architect, actress, singer, fashion designer;- the list was endless. She was a feminist, interested in politics and human rights but never ranted about it or forced her opinion on anyone else. She also loathed casinos, pokies and tupperware parties.

In her youth Marj worked at the Commonwealth Bank. She also had jobs with Adam's Pies and as an airline Hostess with TAA. The stories she told of her flying days were very colourful. Her claim to fame was spilling crab sandwiches over Prime Minister Menzies wife, Dame Patti. She was an avid photographer in her early years, enjoyed sailing and was always a dressmaker.

98 years seems an incredible age and we are grateful for her long life and that we could spend so many years with her."

Please hold our Synod Representatives, Nadia Wilson and Stephen Hall in your thoughts as they sit in the crisply cool surroundings of Churchie this coming weekend for our Diocesan Synod.



In the Anglican Church, a diocese is governed by a Synod, that is, a bishop acting with the advice and consent of representatives of the clergy and laity of the diocese.

In the Diocese of Brisbane, the Archbishop calls the Synod to meet at least once in every year,

to discuss, debate and decide on various matters of business such as the Diocesan budget, legislation governing the Church (i.e. 'Canon law'), and other issues that concern the Church.

The Synod also elects people to various committees and boards in the Diocese, as well as choosing General Synod representatives (i.e. diocesan representatives in the nation Synod held at least once every four years, which brings together all the diocese of the Anglican Church of Australia).

Each year the diocese publishes a comprehensive yearbook outlining the many and varied activities of the diocese. This as a great read and expands our awareness of what we actually do. The year book and the Synod papers including notices of motions are available to all on the Diocesan Website.
