MAPPING THE FUTURE AT MANLY

Over the last 12 months Parish Council has been slowly chipping away at renewing our Mission Action Plan – MAP. So much great work was done on the original MAP to shape the move from Ernest Street and settling into life as a virtual parish, worshipping at the Lota House Chapel. With so much achieved, we need to set our hopes, dreams and aspirations for the next 5 years.

Why do we need a MAP?

Well on one level its an administrative document the Diocese uses to help decision making about even small transactions around our accounts and definitely when big projects like the new chairs and the sound system are in planning. A good MAP will outline the thinking and the planning for life in the years ahead and helps parish council stay on track... while tempering the enthusiasms of clergy with wild ideas.

A MAP is a living document and should reflect things we are currently doing that we should continue and develop, things that are works in progress, and aspirational things we would hope to achieve over the the period. It is not meant to be prescriptive but a guide of decision making



and planning. Key issues for us at St Paul's is that anything we plan needs to be realistic and sustainable given our resources of time, people, talents and finances. We can dream all we like but things have to be doable.

So where are we up to?

Last year we affirmed that the Way of St Paul's and the Vision we have been working with is still very much at the heart of St Paul's. The key words of The Way of St Paul's – Jesus, Spirituality, Communion and Tradition- are on our screen and on our newsletter every week. You can read about them on our website if you need a refresh. We also discussed, nuanced and suggested that the Vision and Values below reflected our common understanding and hopes.

Vision 2030: St Paul's is an inclusive, flourishing faith community, proclaiming and serving, worshipping and learning.

Our Values shape all we aspire to be and do, and give us a measuring point when making decisions.

Faithful: Living in trustful obedience to God as revealed in Jesus Christ, grounded in Scripture, nourished by prayer and the sacraments, and expressed in a life of worship, service, and community. To be faithful is to remain steadfast in our calling as the Church, even in the face of change or challenge.

Imaginative: Embracing creativity and vision, we seek to respond to God's call in ways that speak freshly and meaningfully to our time. Rooted in tradition yet open to the Spirit's movement, we use imagination to reimagine worship, ministry, and mission for a changing world.

COURGEOUS: Guided by the Holy Spirit, we speak and act with boldness for justice, compassion, and truth. Courage calls us to confront fear, resist injustice, and stand with the vulnerable—trusting in God's presence even when the cost is high.

Authentic: Living with integrity and transparency, we strive to be true to who we are—both as individuals and as a church. Authenticity means bringing our whole selves before God and one another, without pretense, and fostering a community where grace and truth meet.

Comprehensive: Honouring the Anglican tradition of breadth and inclusion, we value diversity of thought, worship, and experience. We seek unity in Christ amid difference, welcoming all into a generous and thoughtful faith that holds Scripture, Tradition, and Reason in dynamic tension.

We also agreed that we definitely still share the 5 Marks of Mission of the Anglican Communion which can also be found on our website.



We discussed, nuanced and suggested that 5 sets of Aims for the key areas of Worship, Faith Formation, Pastoral Care, Outreach and Ministry and Stewardship were appropriate for where we are at and where we hope to be in 5 years time.

Worship

Aim: In 2030 we will be a vibrant and engaged community of all ages that gathers joyfully

- · nourished by scripture, sacrament, music and other people of faith
- · challenged, enlivened, motivated, supported and strengthened
- · inspired to be genuine disciples of Jesus The Word in lifestyle and action

Faith Formation

Aim: In 2030 we will be a diverse community growing in knowledge of, love for, and enjoyment of God

- · supported in exploring our faith , individually and as a community
- · able to share and explain our faith clearly
- \cdot able to respond to the challenges and complexities of life
- · people who accept the call to extend the kingdom of God

Pastoral Care

Aim: In 2030 we will be people who respond to need within the three communities of care linked to the parish

- · By offering effective individual pastoral care to our existing and future worshiping communities
- · Collaborating with the staff and families to provide effective pastoral care to the Residents of E M Tooth and The Village Manly communities
- · Reaching out and nurturing those in need of pastoral care within the broader Bayside community

Outreach and Ministry

Aim: In 2030 we will be people visibly engaged in our local community and in helping those in need by:

- \cdot Nurturing the vocation to service of each member of our parish in whatever context is appropriate to their gifts
- · Collaborating with our partner churches and other community groups to contribute to meeting local needs
- · Actively engaging in learning and action that promotes peace, justice and care for the planet
- · participating in the wider mission outreach of the church in the diocese, nation and the world

Stewardship

Aim: In 2030 we will be a diverse community of people who are motivated, empowered and resourced to use our time and talents for ministry by:

- · using our resources efficiently and effectively for mission
- · being financially sustainable, accountable and ethical
- · making efficient and effective use of personnel, processes and resources
- · maximize the widest possible use of our resources

There's lots more as we identified specific goals and actions but we will share those once we've had a bit more work on them. We are in that slightly tedious but important stage of looking at words and actions up close but we are confident we will end up with a really useful and dare we say exciting plan to the next five years.

We are going to have to have another go at it this coming Sunday 26th from 11am -1pm.

Chapel News

There are developments at the Chapel as the temporary wall has now come down!! How exciting. It all looks very nice! Here's some updates .

- We can start using the toilets at the back of the chapel and in Lota House.
- We will be able to access the Parlour and the water and sink in the kitchenette after the 10th of November.
- We will be able to use the door at the ramp side of the chapel once full handover has been provided between the 3rd of November and the 10th November.
- We can now move the cupboard and notice board back onto the back wall..
- Handover is still a couple of weeks away for the administration building.
- Demolition of the administration building will start on the 17th November.
