
Answering the Call: Ordination of Sam McDonell

We share this one from our Marilyne written while at prayer and struck by the plight of safety seekers.

peoples. "You may not know Kelly Latimore's name, but if you've been active on any Christian social media pages in the past few years, you've probably seen his work. One of his most widely shared images — "La Sagrada Familia" — shows the Flight into Egypt with the Holy Family depicted as Latin American migrants. Painted the day after the 2016 presidential election, the icon went viral on social media and ended up serving as the cover art for a collection of Pope Francis' writings on welcoming migrants and refugees. That icon and others like it have drawn both praise and criticism, but above all, they have showcased the power of visual art to spark dialogue and draw connections between the ancient and contemporary."
