Advent Sunday One was all about admiring the angels among us... even the tuba playing ones.



ADVENT BEGINS AND WE SHARE CREATIVITY AND SYMBOLS


Sandra Davis continues her series on our tapestry cushions displayed during the Season of Advent.

The second cushion for Advent appears at the altar on Sunday the 7th December. It is held by Darryl Schmidt, standing at the back of the chapel. It was worked in 2001 by the late Joy Willis and bears the name *"God's Lamb"*.

The lamb has long been recognized as representing Jesus. His cousin, John, referred to Jesus as *"The Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world"*. John made this comment when he was at Bethany and observed his cousin approaching. The next day John repeated this reference to his cousin as *"The Lamb of God"*.

The concept of lambs, sheep and shepherds permeates the Gospels. In fact, in John 10.11 we see Jesus telling a group of Pharisees: *"I am the good shepherd"*. A little further on in the Gospel he repeats this statement. As he grew up in a rural town, Nazareth, in Galilee, Jesus would have been familiar with flocks of sheep and their shepherds. These have obviously made a strong impression on him.

Luke tells us that the news of Jesus' birth was announced by angels to some shepherds tending their flocks in fields outside Bethlehem in Judea. So Joy's cushion fits neatly into the story of Advent. She has the left front leg of the lamb supporting a staff capped by a simplified version of the cross, *Botonnée*.

Sandra also reminds us of our Support of the Bush Ministry Fund:

Saint Paul's folk have been contributing to the annual Bush Ministry Fund since 1998. We have won five awards for our outstanding contributions over the years. The five plaques are attached to the windmill trophy and its water tank. The money raised supports those priests who are stationed in the outer areas of the Brisbane Diocese.

At present we have twelve generous people supporting this outreach.

I plan to collect your money boxes or envelopes from 7th December this year to 21st December. If you are using an envelope, could you please label it with your name and "BMF Collection", to assist me with my files? I shall issue a receipt in due course.

The money box on the right is the original one issued in 1998 and the one on the left is the current one, issued in 2010.

The Bush Ministry fund was established in 1998 to provide support for struggling parishes and clergy in the Western Region of the Anglican Church in South Queensland. Its aim is to maintain a caring ministry to families living in towns and on properties in rural and remote areas of Queensland. Some of these are Bundaberg, Charleville, Cunnamulla, Dalby and Windorah.

Money collected is used in three main ways: assistance with clergy stipend, costs of running a vehicle, replacement of vehicles when needed.

This is a very worthy cause and all support is greatly appreciated.
