As we look ahead, it is important to be open about where we are as a parish. Since the sale of 99 Ernest Street and our move to Lota House, our financial position has continued to tighten, with costs exceeding income. While The Village development at Lota House is now well underway, with the first stage expected to be completed in late 2026, its benefits are still some time away. In the meantime, the parish is only able to sustain part time paid ministry.

The Wardens and Parish Council have been in active conversation with Bishop John about Manly's future. There is strong agreement that Manly should continue as a separate parish and that closure is not an option. We are therefore pursuing models of shared and part time ministry, as encouraged by the Bishop, while recognising the current shortage of available clergy.

In the short term, the wardens and parish council are putting interim arrangements in place to ensure Sunday worship, pastoral care and essential parish life continue smoothly through to Easter.

We ask for your prayers, patience and support as we navigate this transition together, trusting that God continues to call and sustain this community.





Archbishop Sarah Mullally takes up Primatial Cross

Archbishop Sarah Mullally took up the Primatial Cross as the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury during a Confirmation of Election service held at St Paul's Cathedral. Her public duties begin in March, after an Installation service in Canterbury.

The Confirmation of Election is a legal ceremony set within a church service. It marked the moment at which the legal functions of office become vested in the new archbishop. The Archbishop-Elect also took the oath of allegiance and made declaration of assent to her new office.

During the service, the Archbishop of York, along with others participants, gave words of encouragement to Archbishop Sarah. Described as 'the Charge' in the Order of Service, this was a moment of affirmation, mandating Archbishop Sarah in her spiritual, pastoral and missionary responsibilities.

Speaking about the Confirmation of Election, The Rt Revd Anthony Poggo, Secretary General of the Anglican Communion, said: 'I give thanks for Bishop Sarah and the confirmation of her election as the Archbishop of Canterbury. As she prepares for her installation and public ministry this March, I assure her of our prayers and support. May God grant the archbishop understanding and discernment as she works to serve the Member churches of the Anglican Communion, foster bonds of friendship, and encourage them in sharing the Good News of the Christian faith around the world.'

Development Updates

As part of our ongoing communication, I am writing to advise you of some upcoming construction works that may temporarily impact your access around our home.

Change to walkway access


- The existing covered walkway, concrete path and handrails marked in green below will be upgraded.
- From 02 February 2026 construction workers will begin to move the existing scaffolding to a temporary location, as marked in blue below.
- From 09 February 2026 we ask that you please use the new, temporary pathway as marked in blue below.
- From Late March 2026, the original walkway will be reopened for use.
- A temporary noise barrier will be installed between the home and the left-hand side of the main entry to help minimise construction noise whilst works are carried out.
- Covered ambulance access will remain available at all times.

Parking at our home

- We continue to have a limited number of visitor parking spaces at our home. Street parking along Oceana Terrace remains available.
- Please note, reserved car parks will remain available exclusively for visitors with mobility needs.
